Application of provisions of Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) Act to all industrial establishments employing not less than twenty workers.

¹ No. II (2)/LAG/8474/86.— Whereas the Government of Tamil Nadu already extended the provisions of the Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) Act, 1946 (Central Act XX of 1946) to all industrial establishments in which less than hundred workers and not less than fifty workers are employed or were employed on any day of the preceding twelve months;

And whereas, the Government of Tamil Nadu are of the opinion that the said Act shall be made applicable to all industrial establishments in which less than fifty workers and not less than twenty workers are employed or were employed on any day of the preceding twelve months;

And whereas, the notice of the said intention of the Government to make the Act applicable to the said industrial establishments having been published as required by the proviso to sub-section (3) of section I of the said Act;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to sub-section (3) of section 1 of the said Act, the Governor of Tamil Nadu applies the provisions of the said Act to all industrial establishments in which less than fifty workers and not less than twenty workers are employed or were employed on any day of the preceding twelve months.
